Avoca Elementary School 2022-2023 Parent and Family Engagement Plan

What is it?

What is Title I?

Title I is designed to support state and local school reform efforts tied to the challenging state academic standards to improve teaching and learning for students. Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support family engagement. All Title I schools must jointly develop, with parents and family members, a written parent and family engagement policy.

Who is it for?

All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. Avoca Elementary will provide opportunities for the participation of all parents and family members including those with limited English, with disabilities, and of migratory children.

We will:
